NWMS COMMUNITY PROFILING NOVEMBER 2002 REGIONAL SUMMARY

ETHNIC MINORITIES

- Ethnic minority households are most prominent in urban areas.
- High ethnic minority populations are found in the Greater Manchester area (which accounts for 7 of the 13 LAs with a higher than average percentage of ethnic minorities). The remaining five LAs with above average levels of ethnic minority households all located in either East Lancashire or Merseyside
- Rural areas featured a very low number of ethnic minority households.
 Cumbria LAs consistently featured as the LAs with lowest ethnic minority population

DISABLED

- Number of Disability Allowance Claimants is most prominent in urban areas and particularly Greater Merseyside (Local Authorities above regional average include Knowsley, Liverpool, St Helens, Salford, Wirral, and Sefton).
- Knowsley displayed the highest Disability Living Allowance claimant count, almost double the regional average.
- Barrow-in-Furness also displayed a high claimant count for Disability Allowance and the highest for Attendance Allowance
- The lowest levels of Disability Allowance Claimants and Attendance Allowance Claimants were consistently found in Eden.

SKILLS AND LEARNING

- Poor numeracy and literacy skills were more prominent in the urban areas of the North West.
- Knowsley displayed the highest levels of poor literacy and poor numeracy.
- The North West, as a whole, has higher levels of poor literacy and numeracy than the UK average.
- The number of permanent exclusions from school was higher in the inner city areas (top three were Liverpool, Salford, and Manchester)
- Participation of 16 yr olds in education was seen to be higher in LEAs in Cumbria and Cheshire
- At Key Stage 2, the North West average was in line with the England average. Performance was mixed across the sub-regions, with the highest performers being Warrington, Bury, and Cheshire Local Education Authorities

SOCIALLY EXCLUDED

- The North West displayed 8 Local Authorities within the 20 most deprived districts in England.
- Liverpool, Knowsley, Manchester, and Wirral were all in the ranked 10 most deprived wards in England.
- Only 6 Local Authority in North West areas featured within the 100 least deprived districts (Ribble Valley, Congleton, South Lakeland, Eden, Macclesfield, and Fylde)
- Unemployment (Claimant Count) was more prominent in urban areas with a focus on Merseyside LA (Knowsley, Liverpool, Wirral, St Helens being the areas with the highest unemployment claimant count)
- Only one district in the North West displayed 100% of wards with rural classification (Eden). 8 districts, however, had no wards recognised as rural.
